# ARE YOU WINTER READY? STORING PESTICIDES



As our spraying season draws to a close across Canada applicators should take the time to prepare spray equipment and any remaining pesticide supplies before we enter the sometimes long months of snow and ice. Last month we gave some directions and tips on how to properly get your sprayers ready for the winter. This month we will discuss how to properly store your pesticides over the winter in an effort to minimize losses and save money come next season.

#### **DRY PRODUCTS**

Dry pesticide products, such as granular or wettable powders, are generally not impacted by freezing but should be stored in a dry location out direct sunlight.

#### **LIQUID PRODUCTS**

Liquid pesticides may freeze and result in the separation of the active ingredients from the carriers. This reaction may result in coagulation or crystallization which can cause plugging of spray lines in the spring. Some frozen pesticide products can retain effectiveness if applicators follow the right steps when thawing and re-dissolving in the suspension.

Pesticide products have different freezing temperatures due to the presence of hydrocarbon solvents in many formulations. Hydrocarbon solvents actually reduce the freezing point below 0°C. Pesticide product labels often explain a pesticides minimum storage temperature, in addition to whether:

- 1) freezing poses a problem,
- 2) active ingredients separate from carriers if frozen,
- 3) effectiveness of a pesticide is reduced if frozen, and
- 4) the active or inert ingredients go back into suspension after freezing.

Applicators should always be familiar with proper storage directions on their pesticide product label. For more information beyond the label contact the product manufacturer or expert.





